We cannot rest on the laurels of the past and must continue to reinvent and promote the Association. Our history is growing and the nature of our Association is dynamic.



As at the 31<sup>st</sup> of January 2012 we have \$22,981.66.65**cr** in our Cheque Account, \$10,817.69**cr** in our CCMT Account and \$20,000 in a Term Deposit (maturity 8<sup>th</sup> of June). The Term Deposit includes a provision of \$16,519 for LSL Leave Liability as at 30<sup>th</sup> June 2011.

The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees visited Sydney on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> February. Peter Murphy, our SRE teacher at Cherrybrook Technology High, was invited to the address given by Mr António Guterres at the Lowy Institute for International Policy. He was able to arrange for two year 12 students to accompany him. The two students were the Multicultural Representatives from the school's Student Representative Council. There were 120 people in the audience.

We are thankful to the school for the provision of transport and cover for Peter's classes on the day. This was an excellent opportunity for these two students to learn more about the plight of refugees and displaced persons in our world.
